What have you decided to "do" in Lent? To **fast, to pray or to serve generously**? Maybe you have given up chocolate/cake/alcohol/sugar, any of which are **fasting** to some degree. You could put the money you are saving in a "Jar of Change" for WaterAid www.wateraid.org/uk You could use a Lent book to help you **pray** every day of Lent, beyond your usual prayer routine. You could **serve generously**, being prompted by emails from www.40acts.org.uk to do something generous every day that goes above and beyond your usual pattern of service. (Smiling at strangers is harder than you think, costs nothing, but is truly generous and uplifting for them.)

Yet we are as a country living in a time when we don't know what might happen in the future. As I write this letter, we had just left the European Union and we are now on our own. What to expect? Who knows? We just have to wait and see and hope that our politicians will plan carefully and make the right decisions for us all. Can we anticipate that whatever happens will be different and fresh?

Jesus came to turn the tables on what people expected – he brought something different and fresh. He brought in a new age. "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, a new creation has come: the old has gone the new is here". There it is! Right on the pages of the Bible in Paul's letter to the Corinthians, we are told that we are being made new.
